First and foremost, in developing a sociological perspective is realizing that the social world is not a given. It is something to be explored and understood. The overall aim is to introduce you the sociological thinking, including an understanding of cutting-edge concerns, and to start talking and writing sociologically. The themes are pursued in relation to Turkey, Europe and processes of globalisation and will be illustrated through video clips and discussions.

Learning Outcomes: Having successfully completed this course, you will be able to: • Discuss key topics such as society, social institutions, social structure, sociological theories, culture, social stratification, poverty, migration, social change, racism, ethnicity, religion and belief, challenges for sociology in the 21st Century, etc., explain why these themes have attracted the interest of sociologists and what the main challenges are; • Recall and reproduce the main arguments of key sociologists and key ideas; • Articulate an informed and independent argument in essays, discussions and examination questions; • Compare and contrast the main quantitative and qualitative methods including questionnaires, interview, observation and their potential roles in the research process; • Consequently, to be able to look at sociologically the world around us...
